WHAT?

The National Defence College (NDC) of the Malawi Defence Force (MDF), in partnership with the Malawi Computer Emergency Response Team (MWCERT), the Malawi Communications Regulatory Authority (MACRA), will host a symposium titled "Technology, Security, and Development: Problems and Prospects." The theme will focus on "Harnessing Emerging Technology to Achieve Malawi Vision 2063 (MW2063)."

WHY?

The symposium will address the challenges and opportunities posed by emerging technologies in the realms of national security and development in Malawi. With a population density of 222 individuals per square kilometre, Malawi ranks as the fourth poorest country globally, with 70 percent of its population living below the poverty line of less than US\$2.15 per day. Agriculture is the backbone of the Malawian economy; however, most farming remains rain-fed, primarily subsistence-based, and lacks mechanisation.

The 2018 National Security Policy and Malawi Vision 2063 acknowledge the critical role that technology plays in advancing national security and development. Unfortunately, the misuse and abuse of technology can undermine security and hinder progress. To achieve sustainable development, the country must harness the pace and scale of innovation within the industry.

Collaboration among the public, private, and academic sectors is crucial for conducting policy-relevant research that fosters the development of necessary skills, innovations, and technologies to realise the aspirations of MW2063. This partnership enables innovators to focus on their technologies and other vital success factors, ensuring the advancement of effective capabilities in agriculture, education, health, mining, tourism, and more.

WHO?

The Symposium targets individuals and institutions advancing the technology, national security, and development agendas to access contemporary ideas that give the country's frontline services a strategic advantage through cutting-edge capability to achieve MW2063. The symposium's output is to ensure that the country's law enforcement, defence, and security agencies harness emerging technology to improve national security and development. The symposium's outcome will be an academically rigorous and research-based Policy Brief.
